One of our EMTs, Leila, embodies that spirit of service – and then some. Leila began her career in veterinary medicine in the Hamton Roads area. After pursuing a master's degree in emergency and disaster management from Georgetown University, Leila decided to add hands-on experience and joined Fair Oaks Volunteer Fire and Rescue (FOVFR). Leila credits her mom, who was a volunteer EMT, for being her inspiration.

Since joining FOVFR in 2022, Leila has become not only an EMT, but a BLS (basic life support) lead. She routinely puts units in service and works with leadership to ensure members are getting experience – and confidence – when riding.

This year to date, Leila has given approximately 350 hours to Station 21, joining the rest of the membership who should surpass 8,500 total hours by the end of the year. When considering the value of a volunteer hour (\$34.42 according to the Independent Sector), this is an investment of nearly \$300,000 back to the community in riding, training and administrative hours.

FOVFR is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization — our ability to respond to emergencies is contingent on the support of our community who we serve. 

Hundreds of area residents learned about fire safety, emergency medical services and met their local first responders on Saturday, Oct. 11, when FOVFR held its annual Open House.

The free event, held in conjunction with National Fire Prevention Week, featured the theme "Charge into Fire Safety™" and attendees learned about the importance of buying, charging and recycling safely when it comes to





lithium-ion batteries. The fire department also had apparatus displays and tours, safety drills, firefighters demonstrations and challenges, as well as children's activities: face painting, balloon animals and coloring. In addition, there were displays by the

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and the Department of Public Safety Communications (DPSC), the County's 911 call center.
